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Meeting objectives

- Provide procedural updates and an update on schedule changes for IPE 2023 Track 3
- Discuss TPD allocation issues with stakeholders to inform the next ISO Track 3 proposal.
- Discuss the issues to prepare stakeholders for more in depth discussion of proposed solutions during the next working group meeting on September 4, 2024.



Revised IPE 2023 Track 3 Initiative Schedule

- Stakeholder comments suggested the need for more discussion around Track 3A Revised Straw Proposal issues.
- The ISO is still exploring details for Track 3B issues, particularly the Cluster 14 intra-cluster prioritization proposal.
- Working group meetings will help flesh out issues related to TPD allocations to inform the Track 3 Revised Straw Proposal.

Revised 2025 & 2026 schedule for TPD affidavits and studies to accommodate C15 interconnection studies

2025 TPD Year:

- C14 & prior seeking and retention affidavits due September 1, 2025
- TPD study starts November 1, 2025
- TPD study results published March 31, 2026

2026 TPD Year:

- Skip 2026 TPD Cycle
- C14 will have completed its eligibility to seek an allocation in 2025 with its requested deliverability status.
- C15 not impacted because C15 will not be eligible to seek an allocation until 2027 at the earliest.

2027 TPD Year:

C15 & prior seeking and retention affidavits due March 15, 2027



TRACK 3A: MODIFICATIONS TO TPD ALLOCATION PROCESS



Track 3A workgroup discussions will focus on seeking solutions to issues associated with completion of Network Upgrades and resource development

Three categories of issues:

- TPD allocation issues for projects with long lead-time or delayed Deliverability Network Upgrades (DNUs) approved in the ISO Transmission Planning Process (TPP).
- TPD allocation issues for projects with long lead-time or delayed Reliability Network Upgrades (RNUs) where the RNU only moves forward if funded by the projects needing the RNU.
- 3. TPD allocation issues for long lead-time resources that meet the defined resource policy goals of local regulatory authorities for specific technologies and project locations.



Track 3A Revised Straw Proposal's period of eligibility to receive TPD allocations

- Projects will have three consecutive opportunities to seek an allocation, beginning with the affidavit window that closes during the cluster's interconnection facility study.
 - After the third opportunity to seek an allocation, projects that have not received an allocation will be converted to Energy Only (EO).
- It may be difficult for projects with long lead-time NUs and long lead-time generation resources to obtain a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) or shortlist before they are converted to EO, even if the number of opportunities were increased to four.



1. TPD allocation issues for projects with long leadtime DNUs approved in the TPP

- Increasing numbers of projects would be able to come online in the near term as Energy Only (EO), but have to wait some period of years before being given Full Capacity Delivery Status (FCDS).
 - Could a PPA that allows a project to operate as Energy Only for some period of time before becoming FCDS be a viable option?
- What other solutions could be considered?



2. TPD allocation issues for projects with LLT RNUs

- Contracting with projects with earliest achievable CODs further into the future (beyond 5-7 years) could allow projects with LLT RNUs to obtain an allocation of TPD within the 3 (or 4) opportunities they have to seek an allocation of TPD.
 - Are there significant issues that make contracting for projects further into the future inappropriate?
- What other solutions could be considered?



3. TPD allocation issues for long lead-time (LLT) resources that meet the defined resource technology and policy goals of local regulatory authorities

- Should special/unique TPD allocation criteria be developed for LLT resources that meet the defined resource policy goals of local regulatory authorities to allow them to not be at risk of being converted to EO before procurement begins for these resources?
- Will the Central Procurement Entity be authorized and willing to contract with these resources within the period where these resources are eligible to seek an allocation?



The ISO seeks stakeholder input on the issue of continuing allocation group D

- The ISO is seeking stakeholder input on keeping allocation group D, but removing the group D restrictions.
 - A group D project may not request suspension under its GIA, delay providing its notice to proceed, or delay its COD.
- Main pro: Provides increased certainty for LSEs considering projects.
 - Rather than having to wait for the results of the next TPD allocation cycle, some projects will already know they have an allocation of TPD.
- Main con: Will significantly reduce the available TPD capacity, which will reduce the capacity of projects able to be studied in future cluster studies (C16 and beyond).
