Re: Notice of Planned Decisional Classification for Reliability Demand Response Resource Bidding Enhancements Track 2 Initiative

Any objection by the Chairs to this decisional classification is due by July 8, 2022

This is formal notice of Management's decisional classification for the *Reliability Demand Response Resource (RDRR) Bidding Enhancements Track 2* initiative. The objective of this initiative is for the real-time market to better reflect RDRRs' operational characteristics. The initiative proposes two rule changes: adjustments to the operating range of discrete RDRRs to avoid infeasible dispatches, and modifying the discrete RDRR registration cap.

Any objection by the Chairs to the decisional classification is due by July 8, 2022. Otherwise, this initiative will be presented for decision consistent with the classification described below.¹

This initiative falls within the joint authority of the WEIM Governing Body and the ISO Board of Governors, because the tariff changes to implement this initiative would be applicable to WEIM participants in their capacity as participants in the WEIM. This is because WEIM balancing authority areas may use the new RDRR model assuming they have approval from their local regulatory authority and meet the requirements of RDRR participation.

This classification is consistent with the classification noted in the *Stakeholder Initiative Milestones* informational report from the May 10, 2022, WEIM Governing Body meeting.
